



## **Information Sheet for Airlangga Psychology Students**

The *Times Higher Education 100 Under 50* is a ranking of the world's top 100 universities under 50 years old. Our School of Psychology & Counselling is a leading school for studying psychology and counselling in Queensland. The School's undergraduate student numbers continue to grow at a rapid rate, with over 700 continuing students. The School also trains postgraduate students in clinical, educational and developmental psychology, as well as counselling at the state-of-the-art QUT Health Clinics.

### **Professional Accreditation**

The PY45 Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Psychology) is accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) as providing a three-year undergraduate level of training in Psychology.

### **Career Outcomes**

Graduates of this course have skills that can be applied to a variety of professional areas. The analytical, interpersonal, and research skills are ideal for careers in education, human resources, market research, organisational development, policing, public health, human services, and counselling. To pursue a career as a registered psychologist, students must be registered with the Psychology Board of Australia. Currently this involves completing a fourth year of study in psychology plus two years of supervised work experience or two years of further study.

### **Advanced Standing Arrangements for Airlangga Students**

Students who have successfully completed two years of Bachelor of Psychology at Airlangga and met the entry requirements of PY45 may receive eight exemptions (equivalent to one year of full-time study). ### Application Procedure

Students are required to finalise their acceptance and arrive at QUT on time for classes. Students who are required to successfully complete specified English language programs at QUT International College prior to entry into their Bachelors will need to arrive a few months ahead. It is suggested that applications for admission are put in at least ten months prior to the commencement of the Bachelors course, e.g. by 1 May 2014 for the February 2015 entry.

Airlangga students applying for entry into a QUT degree course (e.g. PY45) should complete a QUT Form F and return it with certified copies of academic documents. The Form F can be downloaded from the following web-site:

A non-refundable application fee of AUD\$55 (\$50+10% GST) is normally required from all applicants. F forms are processed on receipt and successful applicants are made an offer for the next available intake. Conditional offers can be made based on results available at the time of application. Offers are confirmed after receipt of final results.

### English language Requirements

The English language requirements for PY45 Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Psychology) course are IELTS 6.5 with no sub-scores lower than 6.0 or approved equivalent. Test scores must be no more than two years before commencement of the QUT course. QUT International College offers the following English language programs to assist international students to meet the English entry requirements of their Bachelors program.
